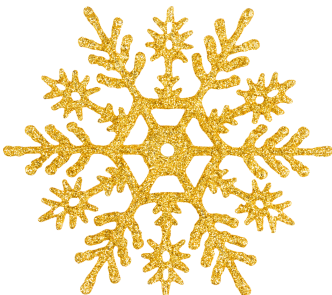

# TRIANGLE OF CARE UPDATE

## December 2021



The Triangle of Care is a national scheme run by the Carers Trust. Notts Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust signed up to the Triangle of Care in 2015.

### Latest News

- Staff teams have now submitted their Triangle of Care self-assessment forms for 2021 to show how they are meeting the six standards of The Triangle of Care
- The Peer Review of the Triangle of Care Self-Assessment Plans across the Trust, will take place via MS Teams on 10th January 2022 at 1.30-3.30pm.
- We will take a sample of the self-assessment plans and review them across the six standards for good practice whilst discussing the areas that need improvement.

### The review includes our three divisions

- 1 Forensic Services
- 2 Mental Health
- 3 Community Health Services

Following the peer review, we will share best practice and work together to look at how we can make improvements in our services for carers and families.

### Here's three samples of our 2021 submissions for the peer review:\*

#### Community Health Services: Children's Speech and Language Therapy

Standard 5. To communicate effectively with carers, families, siblings and friends including an introduction to the service and staff

- Rated Green - Carers/parents are included in packages of care and involved in treatment. The service offers parent support groups including stammering and communication groups whilst the pre-school Complex Needs Team offer a siblings signing group.

#### Community Forensic Services, Low Secure Community Forensic Directorate

Standard 6. To ensure that support and information about support is available to carers, families, siblings and friends

- Rated Amber - As the information provided to carers, families, siblings and friends is limited, teams are reviewing carers support information to ensure this is up-to-date and relevant in future. Amber rated issues are worked through via an action plan

#### Specialist Services Directorate - Alexander House - Intellectual Developmental Disabilities

Standard 4. Rated Green: To ensure that defined posts that are responsible for carers, families, siblings and friends are in place.

- Three designated named carer leads are in place at Alexander House, but all staff support carers and families.

\*Note: The review will address the ratings.

- Carers and Communication Work Group.

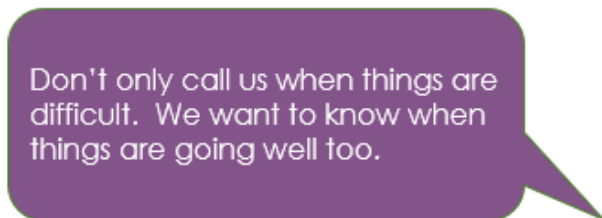
The focus of the event was the Rampton pledge to carers and families made during Carers Week 2021 to improve Communication with carers and staff. This presentation focused on feedback from carers and staff work groups.

- The Triangle of Care and the role of the Responsible Clinician. A Responsible Consultant/Clinician is an individual consultant/clinician, with responsibility for the overall management, continuity and delivery of all care to a patient throughout their hospital stay.
- Dr Trevor Gedeon, consultant Forensic Psychiatrist spoke about the role of the Responsible Clinician in relation to the Triangle of Care.

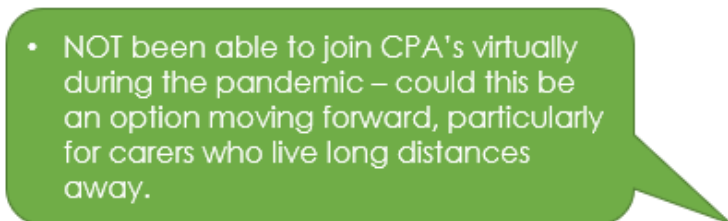
## Some of the Rampton Carers Comments from the workgroups

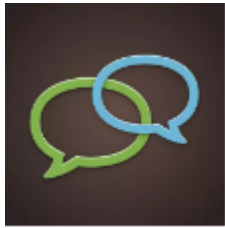
