TuVida provides a range of support and services which can be accessed via the Nottinghamshire Carers Hub. The aim of the service is to increase the self-esteem of Young Carers, bring them in touch with their peers, reduce social isolation, gather their feedback on current services and get their ideas on how to shape future services.

We are providing support and activities to the young carers aged 7-17 via the following methods:

Information, Advice and Guidance

- Information, advice and guidance around your caring role
- Signposting to specialist organisations and other support groups for young carers.

Young Carer ID Card & Emergency Plan

- We can send you a Young Carer ID card which can be used as proof that you are a Young Carer.
- Emergency plan: We can send you a form to complete which will provide information to help support the person you care for in the event of an emergency situation, involving yourself.

Young Carer Support Groups and Activities

- We regularly hold groups and activities for young carers in Nottinghamshire. You'll be able to meet other young carers, make friends, help increase your self-esteem, have fun and learn new skills. Activities may take place in person or online and will include things such as:
- Arts and Crafts
- Quizzes and competitions
- Physical activities; Bowling, paintballing, laser quest, canoeing, rock climbing etc.
- Baking and cooking, and much more!
